Nunyarra is an RACGP-accredited health service committed to providing culturally appropriate care, health promotion, and education for the Aboriginal community. We're more than just a health service; we're a community, and we're seeking someone who is motivated and shares our passion for making a positive impact.

About the Role

Nunyarra is seeking a Casual or Part-Time Practice Nurse – Vaccination to support our short-term vaccination response, with a strong focus on diphtheria vaccination and other routine immunisations.


This role will support Nunyarra's current immunisation activity, including adult and adolescent booster vaccinations, follow-up of eligible patients, opportunistic vaccination, patient education, and participation in dedicated vaccination clinics.

The role will also assist with general practice nursing duties where required. This is a practical, hands-on role suited to a nurse who is confident in immunisation, understands the importance of culturally safe care, and works well as part of a multidisciplinary primary health care team.

What You'll Be Doing:

- Provide high-quality, culturally safe nursing care to patients across the lifespan.
- Deliver immunisations and vaccinations in line with the National Immunisation Program and relevant clinical guidelines.
- Support Nunyarra's diphtheria vaccination response, including dedicated vaccination clinics, patient follow-up, recalls and opportunistic vaccination.
- Promote vaccination awareness and provide clear, culturally safe education to improve vaccine uptake, particularly for diphtheria and routine booster vaccinations.
- Assist with checking patient vaccination status using relevant clinical systems, including Communicare and the Australian Immunisation Register, where required.
- Support vaccine stock management, cold chain requirements and safe vaccine handling processes.
- Work collaboratively with GPs, Aboriginal Health Practitioners, Aboriginal Health Workers, reception staff and the wider multidisciplinary team.

 - Maintain accurate clinical records, including vaccination documentation, recalls, consent and follow-up actions.
 - Contribute to Continuous Quality Improvement activities and health promotion activities related to immunisation and primary health care.
 - Assist with general practice nursing duties where required, including observations, care planning support, recalls and preventative health activity.

What We're Looking For:

A compassionate, motivated and community-focused Practice Nurse who is passionate about delivering high-quality, culturally safe care, with a strong focus on immunisation and preventative health.

You will be confident in delivering vaccinations, communicating clearly with patients and families, and working as part of a team to improve vaccine uptake and access to care. You will bring excellent clinical and communication skills, a practical and flexible approach, and a genuine desire to improve health outcomes for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities.

Essential Requirements

- Current registration as a Registered Nurse or Enrolled Nurse with AHPRA.
- Evidence of completion of an Approved Immunisation Education Program under the Vaccine Administration Code in SA
- Current immunisation qualification or demonstrated competency to administer vaccinations in accordance with South Australian requirements.
- Knowledge of the National Immunisation Program and routine vaccination schedules.
- Understanding of cold chain management and safe vaccine handling.
- Ability to provide culturally safe care to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.
- Strong communication, documentation and teamwork skills.
- Current National Police Clearance, Working with Children Check and relevant employment screenings, or willingness to obtain.

Desirable

- Experience working in Aboriginal health, primary health care, community health or general practice.
- Experience using Communicare or similar clinical software.
- Experience using or checking the Australian Immunisation Register.
- Understanding of recalls, adult booster vaccinations and preventative health programs.
- Experience supporting vaccination clinics, outreach activity or public health response work.
